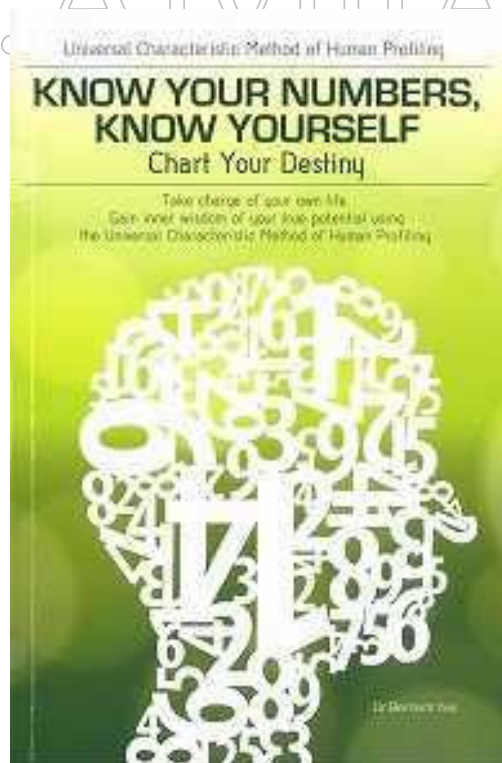

# An Executive Summary of the Universal Characteristic Method of Human Profiling (UCMHP)

Dr. Alvin Ang

**Abstract** The Universal Characteristic Method of Human Profiling (UCMHP) is a numerical method used to profile individuals' character based on their birth dates. This method is claimed to be used widely and is also said to be accurate and robust. This paper is a concise yet critical summary of the UCMHP.

**Keywords** Human Behavior Profiling, Personality Profiling, Numerology, I-Ching, Birth Dates Analyses

## 1. Introduction

The Universal Characteristic Method of Human Profiling (UCMHP), developed by [1], is a numerical method used to profile individuals' character based on their birth dates. This method stems from various branches of philosophy such as metaphysics and numerology [1]. Since these branches of philosophy are not "exact" sciences [2], it is impossible to verify its universal veracity. The only way to test its truthfulness is by empirical statistical sampling. To give further evidence on the accuracy of UCMHP, [1] attempted to use Pythagorean Numerology [3] to demonstrate how it was derived.

[1]'s work, as claimed in his book, comes in two folds:

1. Examining UCMHP's accuracy and robustness by analyzing four hundred thousand individuals' birth dates<sup>1</sup> and
2. Developing the method further through new interpretations of the number patterns found within.

Thus, assuming claim 1 is true, his hypothesis that the UCMHP is robust is intuitively (possibly) valid – since the sample size tested appears large enough (even though we do not have information on the individuals' profiles). However, [1] also suggests to readers that "your character strengths and weaknesses are not carved in stone", thereby giving a probabilistic chance for the model's inaccuracy. That is, the UCMHP model is not hundred percent accurate all the time. Throughout the book, the "subjective probability" [4] stated by [1] is most often cited as ninety percent, whereas in other cases, eighty percent. This percentage appears to be [1]'s subjective probability stemming from his experience. Thus, assuming his claims are true, the UCMHP method should be accurate eighty to ninety percent "of the time".

The focus of the UCMHP model is on the derivation of the Universal Character (UC) number through the UCMHP

chart. This number is able to foretell a person's character in a general way. However, the UCMHP chart contain more numbers and each of them has a specific meaning. [1] did not mention them in his book. Rather, he encouraged people to attend his workshops/seminars to uncover them. Some parts of the book not only gives an account of individuals' characters, they foretell a person's future too.

This paper has five sections. Section 1 is the introduction, followed by Section 2 which describes the UCMHP chart. Section 3 explains the Universal Character (UC) number and Section 4 gives interpretations of additional number combinations. Finally, Section 5 is a summary and options for future works.

## 2. UCMHP Chart

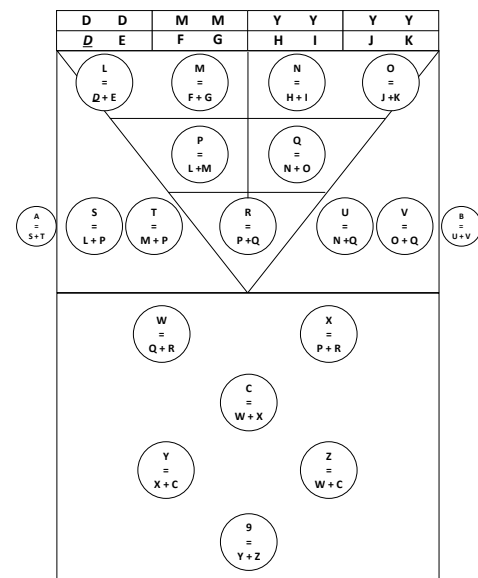


Figure 1 UCMHP Chart [1]

Figure 1 above shows the UCMHP chart developed by [1]. In the first line of the figure, "DD-MM-YYYY" relates

to “Day–Month – Year”. This is where the individual’s birth date is placed. The rest of the alphabets (D to Z) intuitively suggests simple additions to form the chart. However, if any addition ends up with a double digit ( $\geq 10$ ), simply add the two digits to form a single digit. Example 1: If any alphabet ends up as 13, we take  $1 + 3 = 4$  as the single digit. Example 2: If any alphabet ends up as 16, we take  $1 + 6 = 7$  as the single digit.

Furthermore, Yeo [1] suggested two ways to double check the UCMHP chart.

1. Method 1: Referring to Figure 1, the bottom most number should always be 9.
2. Method 2: By checking R:
  - a. If R is 1, 4 or 7, then C can only be 3.
  - b. If R is 2, 5 or 8, then C can only be 6.
  - c. If R is 3, 6 or 9, then C can only be 9.

Although every alphabet (and its corresponding number) suggests a specific meaning, [1] did not mention them in his book. Rather, the book’s emphasis was on the alphabet “R”, which is also known as the Universal Character (UC) Number. Details of the other alphabets can only be known through [1]’s workshops/courses

### 3. Universal Character (UC) Number

[1] mentioned that “R” can only take on the values 1 to 9. For each of these numbers, a character type is attached to it. They are:

- UC Type 1: The Extrovert Innovator
- UC Type 2: The Extrovert Negotiator
- UC Type 3: The Extrovert Task-Oriented
- UC Type 4: The Extrovert Administrator
- UC Type 5: The Unpredictable Developer
- UC Type 6: The Introvert Protector
- UC Type 7: The Introvert Entrepreneur
- UC Type 8: The Introvert Responsible
- UC Type 9: The Introvert Creator

Details of each UC Type can be found in Appendix A.

### 4. Interpretations of Additional Number Combinations

Although it was mentioned earlier that the meanings of the other numbers (or rather, alphabets besides “R”) can only be found in [1]’s workshops, the book did give away a couple of interpretations of some numbers and their combinations. They are:

1. The alphabet “C” on the UCMHP chart (Figure 1).
2. Paired Numbers
3. Special Number Pairs

#### 3.1. The Alphabet “C”

If the alphabet “C” is:

- 3 – That person is an Idealist (a dreamer, visionary, optimist and utopian).
- 6 – That person is a Pragmatic (logical, practical, down-to-earth and commonsensical).

- 9 – That person is a Realist (a person who tends to view or represent things as they really are e.g. a naturalist or rationalist).

#### 3.2. Paired Numbers

These paired numbers come only in the form of 29 combinations. The interpretation of these Paired Numbers can be found in Appendix B.

#### 3.3. Special Number Pairs

Special Number Pairs are

- i. “Finger Gap” Numbers
- ii. “Meat Eater” Numbers
- iii. Marital/Relationship Problem Numbers
- iv. Extra Martial Affair Numbers
- v. Emotionally Sensitive Numbers
- vi. “Cherry Blossom” Numbers
- vii. “Professor-type” and “Separation” Numbers
- viii. “Life-time Challenges” and “Obstacles” Numbers
- ix. Vice Numbers

Each of them can only be found in special areas of the UCMHP, unless otherwise stated. Their numbers and meanings can be found in Appendix C.

## 5. Summary and Future Work

This paper is a critical summary of [1]’s UCMHP method of defining individuals’ character through their birth dates. It is claimed to be accurate and widely used. The future work for this could be: 1) to seek practical applications for this method. For example applying this method to business management theories or using it to improve talent searching in Human Resource Management (HRM) strategies. 2) To conduct statistical analyses on this method, validating the model. 3) Comparing UCMHP with the Enneagram personality model.

## Appendix A – Interpretation of UC Type Numbers

This Appendix gives the corresponding character traits of the nine UC Type numbers stated in [1].

### A1 UC Type Number 1 – Extrovert Innovator

- Subconsciously take on leadership roles.
- Concerned about social harmony.
- Persistent.

- Considerate, generous and helpful. Willing to compromise their personal interests for the good of others.
- Optimists.
- Generous with praises and rightfully credits the deserving ones.
- Excellent interpersonal and public relation skills.
- Mild-mannered.
- Able to make others feel at ease.
- Ability to draw out another person's sense of compassion and initiate their empathy for others.
- Believe that people are honest, decent and trustworthy in general.
- Selfless and prioritizes other people's interests ahead of his or her own.
- Compassionate, sympathetic, kind, affectionate, friendly, and cooperative.
- Suspicion and antagonism are foreign to his or her nature.
- Genuinely interested in helping others out with their problems.
- Wise, with a flair for showing their knowledge.
- Enjoy exploring uncharted territories and have a strong desire to be first in everything they do.
- Analytical prowess.
- Creative while being detailed and meticulous.

#### *Character Weaknesses:*

- Attract backstabbing because they tend to be trustworthy, and straightforward.
- Lack of foresight may lead them to career or business failures.
- May be involved in a couple of relationships throughout their lifetime.
- Bad at managing personal finances.
- Their youth period may be a difficult time because they are likely to be dissatisfied with their circumstances and long for self-sufficiency.
- Having a strong and independent character may result in lead to being bossy, demanding, selfish, egotistical and self-serving.

#### *Other Traits:*

- Likely to get married after the age of 28.
- May to have digestive problems, causing them to be overweight.
- When they put their fingers together, there may be gaps. These gaps signify their many life challenges.

### A2 UC Type Number 2 – Extrovert Negotiator

- Excels in self-expression and persuasion, making them very good salespersons, trainers, coaches, consultants, presenters and advisors.
- Good at verbal sparring, but always thinking first before speaking.
- Appearing to be outgoing on the outside, but conventional and traditional on the inside.
- Likes simplicity and straightforwardness.
- Dislikes complexity and ambiguousness.
- Hardworking, mature and charismatic.
- Get along well with elders.
- Independent and may not follow advice given.
- Friendly and calm with a pleasant personality.
- Persistent and dedicated to tasks. Able to successfully direct and complete what they set out to do.
- Appreciate arts and unusual ideas but conversely regard them as unimportant subjects.
- Adventurous.
- Creative and aware of their emotions.
- Hold unconventional beliefs

#### *Character Weaknesses:*

- Appears slow in responding during discussions because of his/her trait of thinking first before speaking.
- Softhearted and a likely targets for cheats.

- Tends to seek stimulation in the company of others and enjoys being with others.
- Forward-looking.
- Focused to know exactly what they want out of life.
- Action-orientated. Full of energy and enthusiasm, frequently portraying a “Yes!” or “Let’s go!” attitude.
- Sociable, interactive and talkative. Conversation starters as well as good listeners. Mingles well with people from all walks of life.
- Exudes unrestrained confidence.
- Enjoys organizing or mobilizing people.
- Assertive and vibrant.
- Naturally placed under the limelight.
- Manipulative and influential, being able to convince others with their tactically-planned agendas.
- Able to enforce traditional practices inherited from traditions handed down to them from a higher authority.
- Very loyal and ardent lovers.

**Character Weaknesses:**

- Aggressive and possesses bad temperament.
- Impatient with slow thinkers and indecisiveness, leading to frustrating working relationships.
- Mischievous.

- Bluntness of speech, causing relationships to be cyclical. May lead to disastrous results.

- Gets along well with superiors.
- Independent, task-oriented, highly-capable, trustworthy, conscientious and focused.
- Aware of their own strengths and weaknesses.
- Works effectively and efficiently.
- Systematic, thorough, meticulous, practical and realistic.
- Prefers hands on approach to life and relationships.
- Uses facts, figures and logic.
- Very successful at the things they do. For example, if he/she is a student, he/she will achieve high scores in examinations.
- Highly knowledgeable, loves knowledge and street smart.
- Calculative, always wanting to find out the benefits before carrying out a task.
- Prefers to report to only one person at work.

- Builders and architects of the organization they are a part of.
- Strong character.
- Possesses sharp instincts.
- Unswayable.

- Principled – based work ethics.
- Charismatic and engaging,
- Pushes himself or herself hard to achieve goals.
- This hardworking trait, combined with a strong sense of realistic practicality and firm beliefs often places him or her in positions of status and authority.
- Not likely to be in clerical or administrative positions.
- Boldly vocal.
- Pragmatic. Not a dreamer.
- Ability to experience “sudden rushes of energies” for them to function at peak performance. Yeo [1] calls this “the optimal state of the mind and being”.
- Soft-hearted.
- Risk-taker both in business and life ventures.
- Well-travelled. Enjoys venturing and exploring various geographical locations.
- Trustworthy and loyal in courting or spousal relationships.

**Character Weaknesses:**

- Requires restraint to his adventurous nature in order to accomplish peak performance in life.
- Though he or she is inwardly soft-hearted, others may find it difficult to tell from the outwardly behavior.
- In courting or spousal relationships, his/her partner may have a wrong impression that he/she is un-dutiful because he/she is not constantly physically available. However, this is untrue as he/she is still trustworthy. It is only because he/she is born an adventurer that his need for freedom thrives. Thus, he/she needs an understanding partner.
- High expectations of others to be as driven as he/she is, even though this is sometimes not possible.

## A8 UC Type Number 8 – Introvert Responsible

- Tough exterior coupled with a strong sense of justice and righteousness, yet conservative and passive.
- Good with paperwork.
- Most comfortable working under just one boss, thus not found in leadership roles in their workplace.
- Soft-hearted and family-oriented, which makes him/her a trustworthy friend.
- If he’s a man, he will be very responsible and make a good husband.
- Quiet and low-key individual.
- His/her counterpart will be an extrovert who will have high social exuberance.
- But his/her reservations does not mean he/she is shy. He/she simply requires more stimulation to open up.
- Enjoys spending time alone.
- Talks and opens up only to people that they are familiar with. But does not mind being the center of attention when among friends. During then, he/she can be very lively and engaging.

The “Meat Eater” Number refers solely to a single digit within the inverted triangular region of the UCMHP chart. That is, it can only be “L”, “M”, “N”, “O”, “P”, “Q” or “R”.

Ninety percent of those who have a “3” or an “8” in this region have a strong preference for eating meat, while the remaining ten percent tend to eat only oily or fried vegetables.

### C3 Marital / Relationship Problem Numbers

Referring to the inverted triangular region, individuals who have these numbered pairs are likely to have marriage or relationship problems:

- 4 – 8 or 8 – 4
- 5 – 5
- 6 – 6
- 1 – 5 or 5 – 1
